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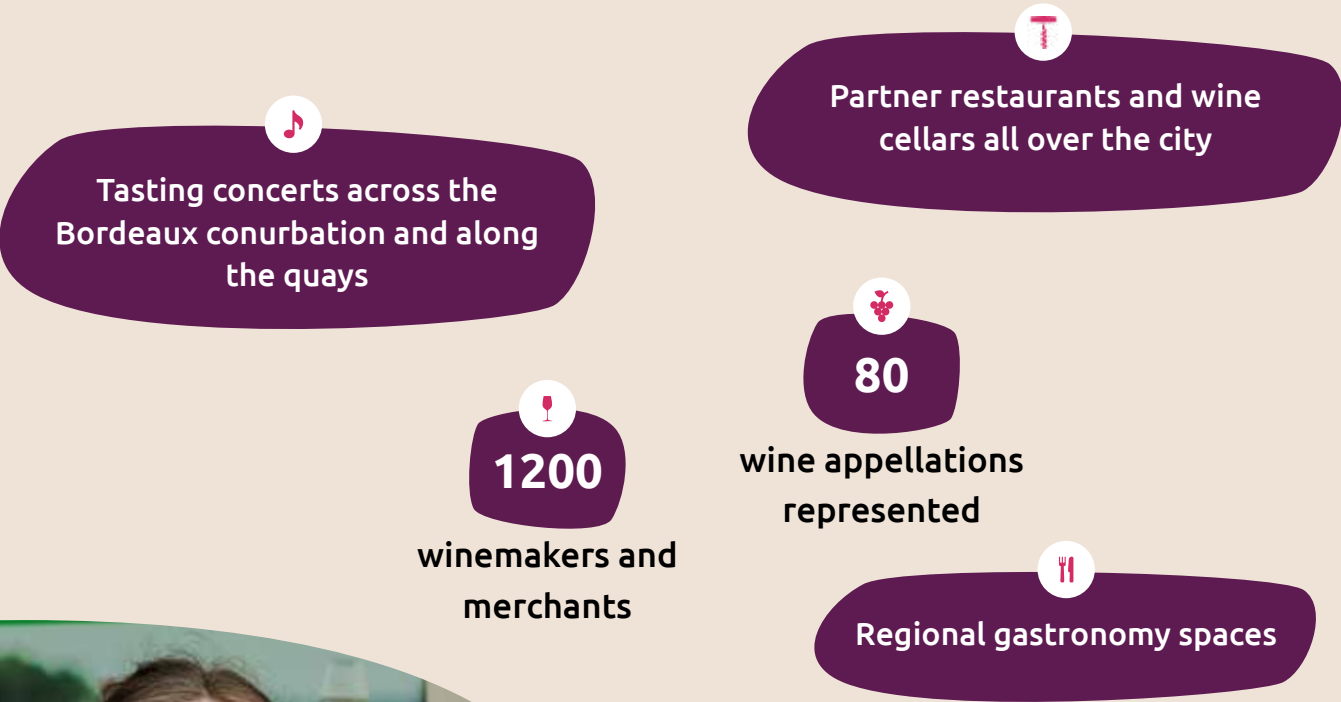

From 20th to 23rd June 2024, in the run-up to the festival, Bordeaux's restaurants are wearing their claret colours with pride; restaurants, delicatessens and wine bars are promoting Bordeaux wines and, in their own way, opening a door into their world, either through special menus, activities or wine tasting in the company of winegrowers and merchants, or by pairing them with local seasonal produce... Each event confirms Bordeaux's identity and gets us in the orbit of those who love, work, serve and pair Bordeaux wines!

CENON - Parc du Cypressat

Fête du Cypressat "du vin au vert"

Concerts, activities and wine tasting

The 17 hectares of nature that constitute Parc du Cypressat are home to 1200 trees, as well as a few rows of vines as testament to wine's omnipresence in Bordeaux. Having opened in 2010, the park celebrates summertime, nature and wine every year! The Cypressat festival 'Du vin au vert' - a word play on "glass of wine" and nature ("vert" means "green") - welcomes families and lovers of wine, nature or history for an open-air evening full of music, wine tasting, food trucks, a story walk, workshops and a treasure hunt.

ARTIGUES - Jardin du Cuvier de Feydeau

Concert by LOTONE - Hybrid music and wine tasting

It is only right that the gardens of this old wine estate - now a creative space and cultural venue - should play host to a perfect fusion of vines and music! The duo Lotone, featuring musicians Baptiste Dupré and David Millet, is a hybrid project: a convergence of the spirits of these two travellers who love both the silence of the mountains and the songs of the cities, creating indie song with a grounding in folk music that naturally navigates from acoustic to electro.

SAINT-MÉDARD-EN-JALLES - Le Jardin Secret du Carré-Colonnes

**Concert by ANTOINE SOUCHAV' - revisited electro on
harpsichord and wine tasting**

Le Carré-Colonnes has become the first French national stage to cultivate its own garden... and in this quirky, intimate space you'll find vegetables and flowers that grow around works of art made out of bamboo and wood gathered nearby: a union of art and nature... Expect a unique and out-of-the-ordinary experience. Yellow Magic Harpsichord is a recital by Antoine Souchav', based on transcriptions of the Japanese group Yellow Magic Orchestra. The melodies, hidden under layers of synthesisers, have been extracted and revisited for the harpsichord: an instrument that's a world away from the original work, producing a series of dense, energetic pieces that often make you want to dance in a temporal and geographical diagonal that is impactful both for its complete incongruity and its natural clarity.

PESSAC - Domaine de Camponac

"Primeurs à Pessac", with a concert by HARRISSON SWING - Gypsy jazz and wine tasting

Near to the Jacques Ellul multimedia library, in harmony with its 18th century château, Parc de Camponac is a 3-hectare haven of greenery which harbours several centennial trees. Beneath their boughs, taste organic wine to a backdrop of gypsy jazz by Harisson Swing. These five Bretons aim to sweep you up in their good mood and get you dancing freely along to their explosive mix of swing and gypsy jazz: a festive atmosphere in all its splendour, guaranteed to make you dance the night away!

BEGLES - ChapitÔ

Concert-show by MALOU BLUE - Song, poetry, dance and wine tasting

In the heart of the Terres Neuves neighbourhood, at the ground floor of the BT7, the atypical ChapitÔ has become a hotspot in the suburb of Bègles, where anyone can come and spend some time, grab a coffee, get information, walk and participate in a range of eclectic activities: culinary workshops, circus arts, DIY workshops, and more... In celebration of the Bordeaux Wine Festival, the venue has, of course, invited a local and uncategorisable artist: Malou Blue plays jazz fusion, sings and dances to classical texts backed by a piano and trumpet... Come and hear Apollinaire and Baudelaire in a new way while enjoying a glass of wine...

BOULIAC - Esplanade de Bouliac

Concert by MATCHBOX - Rock&Folk and wine tasting

Barely a few kilometres from Bordeaux, admire the most beautiful panorama over the Port of the Moon from the city's "flowery balcony"! Let the music of Bordeaux-based trio

Matchbox Trio take you to new heights. They formed in 2021 thanks to a shared love of Johnny Cash and Hank Williams. Each of them brings their own influences: Pierre with his rock-infused bass, Aurélien with his swing-inspired drumming and Arnaud's bluegrass-folk guitar (plus vocals). Between rock and country, the group offers up an electric sound straight out of the 50s, with lively tempos and, at times, a heavier sound, at others an intimate acoustic moment, during which their passion for traditional folk becomes apparent. Your job is to synchronise your wine tasting to their tempo!

LORMONT - Château du Prince noir

Concert by ARMONIA & Co - Jazz and wine tasting

From a belvedere over the Garonne, at the entrance to Bordeaux, this unique chateau - which has been destroyed and rebuilt numerous times - has looked out over Lormont since the 11th century. As the theatre for the negotiations that ended the Hundred Years' War, the "Black Prince's Castle" takes its name from the nickname of Edward Woodstock, the Prince of Wales and Aquitaine, who stayed here during the 14th century before the site became a country retreat for the archbishops of Bordeaux. Entirely renovated from 2007 onwards, they have a special jazzy evening in store for you! Made up of clarinet player and vocalist Armonia and pianist Serge Moulinier, duo Armonia&Co promise a jazz and swing concert featuring music from the 20s to the 40s. There promises to be a warm, original and intimate atmosphere that will whisk you away to the cradle of jazz, New Orleans, as well as Chicago and the great era of the New York clubs...

It is an enormous pleasure for me and the whole team of the 'National Stage' Carré-Colonnes to welcome the Bordeaux Wine Festival to our "Secret Garden", the only artistic and poetic vegetable garden in France, created by our partner company, Opéra Pagai. Pleasure in tasting, the joy of discovery...

From 27th to 30th June, Bordeaux's quayside is to be a bustling melting pot, where festivalgoers will have the opportunity to meet 1200 men and women from the local wine industry: producers and merchants representing 80 appellations. Under a warm atmosphere, taste beautiful wines while learning more about how they are produced, their environmental impact and techniques used in their production: honing your taste buds and your knowledge.

On your marks!

From 27th June onwards, **9 appellation stands** will be open along the Garonne quayside.

An opportunity to taste a **Grands Crus Classé from the 1855 classification**: historic jewels in Bordeaux's crown.

Finally, the **Bordeaux Wine School** (L'École du Vin de Bordeaux) is hosting quirky and educational workshops throughout the festival, designed for learning while having fun.

Bordeaux's vineyards have demonstrated a massive commitment to ensuring the survival of the wine industry, continually improving their practices. **Today, more than 75% of vineyards have received recognition for their environmental initiatives.**

The appellation stands

1 MEDOC WINES

The illustrious Médoc - with its prestigious appellations and wine tourism route, sprinkled with chateaux whose names are renowned across the world - is sure to draw you in, but it's the passion and savoir-faire of the winemakers that will keep you there. Espousing both tradition and innovation, they produce exceptional wines. The 100 million bottles that travel every year from the peninsula around the globe reflect, above all, the philosophy of the hundreds of small wineries: 93% of which proudly display their environmental certification. Juicy, fresh reds or powerful, tannic ones: both are perfect for afternoons on the terrace. Open up a window onto wine tourism in the Médoc, where they propose themed tours and workshops.



2 BORDEAUX WHITES - DRY WHITES - SWEET WHITES

The Bordeaux Whites stand invites you on a sensorial journey through 2000 years of wine history, from the translucent light given off by chilled dry whites to the golden glimmer of intoxicating sweet wines. Between clay-limestone hills and the banks of the Garonne, each grape variety - from aromatic Sauvignon to generous Sémillon - contributes to this symphony of flavours. The other factors are the mist, the sun, the naturally perfect cellars... and the know-how of the winemakers, of course! An ode to the diversity and elegance of Bordeaux's white wines.

3 THE CÔTES

The stand representing the appellations found on the slopes ('côtes') of the right bank of the Garonne portrays the authenticity of winemaking. In Côtes-de-Bourg, Graves de Vayres, Côtes de Bordeaux, Blaye, Cadillac, Castillon, Francs and Sainte-Foy, a web of small family estates work with their unique soils, demonstrating passion, creativity, innovation... and often a rebellious streak! The pioneering spirit of the "Côtes de Bordeaux", combined with their rich heritage, produces ambitious and environmentally friendly vintages that are testament to proudly held values: conviviality, generosity and authenticity.

4 MOUTON CADET

In 1930, driven by an ambition to bring the grandeur of Bordeaux's terroir to as many as possible, Baron Philippe de Rothschild created Mouton Cadet. Almost a century and three generations later, Mouton Cadet continues to evolve, with an increasingly larger proportion of their wine production turning to organic methods. The vision remains the same: offer unparalleled quality from the vine stock to the glass, while respecting the environment and stakeholders in the industry - from producers to consumers.

5 SAINT-ÉMILION - POMEROL - FRONSAC

Around the village of Saint-Emilion, a star attraction that attracts 2 million visitors a year, 10 exceptional red wine satellite appellations spread over the hills in the Libourne area, whose vines were planted 2 millennia ago. In these historic lands, tradition joins with innovation while moving towards sustainable production methods. Make the most of winemakers' expertise, learn about their green transition, come and discover the harmony, finesse and intensity of the characteristic Merlot, Cabernet Franc and Cabernet Sauvignon blends which have always brought renown to this exceptional region.

6 NOUVELLE-AQUITAINE WINES

The Nouvelle-Aquitaine Wines stand acts as a crossroads for exploring the viticultural treasures of the second largest wine region in France, running from the Basque Country to the confines of the Loire. Come and meet the winemakers who grow rare grape varieties while respecting the environment, and taste wines which exalt the expression of the grape through a mosaic of colours and nuances: imprints of each soil's personality.

Baptised in 1896, Belem has had an eventful life, changing nationality and function multiple times over the years, yet she remains the last great 19th-century French merchant ship still sailing today! As a national symbol and in recognition of its cultural value and inestimable historical importance, she was listed as a historical monument in 1984, and this year transported the Olympic Flame from Greece to Marseille.

Built in 1948 in Denmark by the J. Ring-Andersen shipyard, she was first a cargo ship, then a fishing support ship, after which she became a Hollywood star before undergoing traditional restoration, which returned her original characteristics while bestowing her with the latest technology. She has a capacity of 100 passengers at sea and 150 while docked, with a main lounge, several cabins and modifiable common areas. This historic ship is one of the last traditional European tall ships.

The Morgenster

Built in 1919 as a herring lugger under the name of 'De Vrouw Maria', in 1927 she was lengthened by 7 metres and transformed into a motorised fishing boat. In 1959, she was renamed Morgenster and remained a fishing boat until 1970, after which she shone in competitive fishing, and she has even hosted pirate radio! Her current owners, Marian and Harry Muter, reconverted Morgenster into a sailing boat in 1983, then her once more in 2008, this time as a brig to act as a training boat.

The Mutin

YAWL - TWO-MASTER - 350 m2 of sails

The sailing school ship Mutin is the oldest unit in the French Navy still sailing; she launched in 1927 and served as a training ship for elite navigators. During the Second World War, she was used for spying missions by the British, before returning to her role in the French navy. She is a testament to maritime history, taking part in ship gatherings while executing her original function as a training ship. The tale of how her name plaque was lost during the war and found years later is an interesting story.

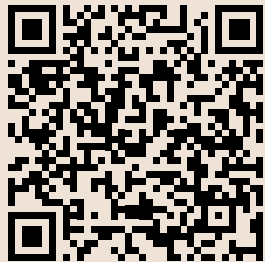

Exhibitions

Bordeaux, vineyards and nature

Placed at the centre of the event, in front of the Miroir d'Eau, this exhibition reveals the most poetic and wildest moments found in nature, inviting us to share in the splendour of the environment that surrounds winemakers. From the buzzing bees to gentle lambs, from the insects' waltz to the horses' haughty nature, and from discrete fauna refuges to little heritage gems: nature elegantly unfurls beside wine workers. These images' beauty is captivating, but they also bear witness to the growing commitment shown by Bordeaux estates in embracing and preserving the vibrant biodiversity found amidst the vines.

Did you know?

The 1855 Grands Crus Classés classification, which remains an authority today, was established by order of Emperor Napoléon III ahead of a presentation of Gironde wines at the Paris World Fair. This made official the ranking established by decades of Le Syndicat des Courtiers de Commerce, who observed the notoriety and value of various chateaux: their ranking and stability were recognition of the quality of their soil and the savoir-faire of each vintage.

A DJ will then take the reins until the drone show: the climax of this remarkable evening, over which La Belle Saison offers a breathtaking view.

An environmentally and socially conscious festival

FROM 27TH TO 30TH JUNE

As a committed stakeholder, Bordeaux Fête le Vin strives to improve every aspect of its organisation every year, aiming to guarantee an accessible, inclusive and responsible experience, helping visitors and partners to reduce their environmental impact thus allowing them to enjoy the festival ethically.



A conscious festival

Disabled access

The appellation villages and all partner spaces are accessible for persons with reduced mobility.

- Adapted ticket desks and counters
- Stands equipped with access ramps
- Reduced gradient of cable covers
- Reserved drop-off points when arriving on-site
- Signposts across the site
- In light of the ships' narrow structures and sloped access at low-tide, complete access to ship tours is not guaranteed. Certain jetties are accessible for persons with reduced access, and where possible captains will propose adaptations.

Non-gendered toilets

As an inclusive festival, Bordeaux Fête le Vin is sweeping away stereotypes: the toilets are accessible and open to all, regardless of gender!

The Angela scheme

Just uttering the phrase "Where is Angela?" is a way for anyone feeling unsafe or harassed - regardless of age or sex and whatever the time of day - to ask for help. Partners of the scheme (nightlife establishments, shopkeepers, demonstration organisers, etc.) have committed to assisting victims; Bordeaux Fête le Vin is one such partner and has ensured that the Angela scheme will be enacted by all of its partners.

Solidarity-based recruitment

To boost access to the labour market for people struggling to find work, La Maison de l'Emploi in Bordeaux, specialists in this issue, have taken charge of recruiting ticket office agents and welcome staff for Bordeaux Fête le Vin.

The festival's organisation committee also works throughout the year with recruitment services in Artigues and Blanquefort for disabled and young people respectively.

In moderation... meaning with awareness and responsibly!

Bordeaux Fête le Vin is a "dégustation" festival, meaning that you should savour and appreciate rather than take risks and potentially miss out. In a dedicated prevention space, APIPAF 33 makes visitors aware of the risk of unmoderated consumption, providing free breathalyser tests and activities demonstrating the dangers of alcohol. Excessive alcohol consumption is dangerous for your health, drink in moderation - and if in doubt, test yourself for free!



Analysing to progress

Since 2021, Bordeaux Fête le Vin has been ISO 20121 certified: certification awarded to events that have opted for sustainable organisation according to strict criteria. While this certification applauds commitments to preserving the environment, it also seeks to amplify and carry such commitments further. After the festival, Bordeaux Tourisme et Congrès ask volunteers who have attended the festival to answer a questionnaire in order to evaluate the quality of their experience, the events and tourism products. Similarly, the carbon footprint is estimated so as to measure the environmental impact of each edition, comparing it to that of previous editions, evaluating the impact of new measures, and so on... This feedback is precious, contributing concretely to improving future editions of the Bordeaux Wine Festival.

Solidarity evening

A solidarity evening is organised to invite those who have benefited from social organisms partnered with the Bordeaux Métropole Office de Tourisme et des Congrès as part of the Bordeaux Solid'air initiative.

Reduce and reuse waste

To reduce the impact of waste produced at the festival, Bordeaux Fête le Vin has taken multiple concrete and multilateral actions, and continues to progress.

- Zero plastic: once again “no plastic object sold at the event”.
- 100% compostable: each container, item of cutlery, cup and napkin used at the stands must conform to this rule.
- Cut down waste: the size of containers at food stands is being reduced significantly, adapted to their products.
- Sort your waste! A “green brigade” will be on hand to make the public aware of the importance of sorting waste correctly.
- Reuse and recycle: corks are to be collected and treated, while organic waste is to be collected by Détritivores and oysters by Coquille.
- Reusing: partners and attendees are invited to bring their own water bottle to avoid using plastic bottles. Drinking water fountains are to be placed all over the site.
- Don't drop your butts: pocket ashtrays will be distributed for free at visitor information points (in partnership with the Ceseau association, while stocks last).



Reuse equipment

Most of the materials needed in the organisation of Bordeaux Fête le Vin are to be reused or given to associations upon the event's conclusion, thanks to our partners, Côte Ouest.

Spreading awareness

Throughout the 2024 edition of the Bordeaux Fête le Vin, an exhibition is to be dedicated to environmental issues facing the wine industry, how they might develop and the festival's responsible initiatives.

A responsible economy

Environmental issues also depend on the economy. For this year's edition, Bordeaux Fête le Vin is promoting local producers and seasonal produce, in addition to highlighting local savoir-faire.

Bordeaux: a destination with a conscience

Alongside stakeholders in the conurbation's tourism, Bordeaux is committed to preserving our environment. This daily investment saw the city win the title of 'European Capital of Smart Tourism' in 2022.

Bordeaux: vineyards with a conscience

Bordeaux Fête le Vin promotes organic and environmentally conscious winegrowing by supporting its stakeholders. In 2014, 35% of vineyards' surface area were certified for their environmental approach: in 2024, it has risen to 75%! Today, Gironde is the department with the largest surface area in France to be cultivated organically. Each appellation stand reflects this growing commitment from wine stakeholders in the face of environmental, social and economic challenges.

Recognising certification

Bordeaux covers a variety of farming, production methods, choices regarding the environment, and therefore various labels and types of certification. Certain domains hold multiple certifications.

A quarter of Bordeaux's vineyards are organic.

Half of Bordeaux vineyards' surface area (50,000 hectares) are certified for their high environmental value.

Adapting to climate change

The climate is a major factor in the quality of wine. It impacts the soil, conditions the vintage and determines the volume of the harvest. The changes winemakers are facing and those to come plus uncertainty are driving vineyards to anticipate and adapt. But how?

- By working to introduce new, more resistant and adapted grape varieties to a warmer climate, while keeping Bordeaux's characteristic aromas.
- By adopting new practices like reevaluating their plot implantations to reduce exposure to the sun, delaying pruning, favouring grass growth among the vines...
- By reducing the carbon footprint of the Bordeaux wine sector (down 39% between 2007 and 2022, target of 54% down in 2030).
- By restoring landscape diversity, particularly via agroforestry. Trees and bushes are returning to vines or near to plots. By adding height to Bordeaux's vineyards, the landscape will be all the greener: rows of fruit-bearing trees beside rows of vines, hedges around plots, bushes between two vinestocks... There are multiple advantages: developing biodiversity, carbon capture, creating microclimates, and so on... Numerous properties are on board and this movement is growing fast.

A global vision of sustainable action

Today, the vineyards of Bordeaux are committed to preserving the environment. Bordeaux has already made significant progress, but the industry also faces social and economic issues, for example, the plight of those working among the vines, or changes in ownership. The vineyards are committed to upholding corporate social responsibility standards, all by contributing to a more sustainable and equitable society, continuing to innovate, attracting talent, and by supporting the region.

In May 2021, the Bordeaux wine interprofessional organisation rolled out a collective approach to CSR for all members of the industry: Cultivons Demain. This strategy is based on 4 pillars:

- Contribute to an attractive industry: integration, job creation, training, security...
- Support our region: local jobs, solidarity, coexistence...
- Preserve the environment: renewable energy, biodiversity, carbon reduction...
- Cultivate dialogue: ethics, traceability, responsible consumption and purchasing...

Biodynamic methods, draft horses, ecological corridors... Estates open their doors to show the public these new practices put in place in the vineyards and in the cellars as part of guided tours.



The Festival: tips and instructions

Moving about

During construction and deconstruction of the festival along the quays, traffic on the quays and tram and bus services may be temporarily impacted. You will soon be able to find all practical information at www.bordeaux-fete-le-vin.com.

Tips for an enjoyable experience

Leave the car at home

Come via bike, tram or train! A large bicycle parking zone awaits at Quinconces, at the entrance to the festival. Park & Ride schemes using the city tram network provide continuous access to the festival, with no traffic jams.

Be prepared for warm weather

Stay hydrated by bringing your own water bottle; drinking fountains are available onsite. Don't forget a hat and sunscreen: details which make all the difference... particularly when you forget them!

Watch over your children

Several activities are accessible for children, but always with supervision. Keep an eye out!

Keep an eye on your consumption

The glass received with the Tasting Pass has a 5cl gauge, chosen to allow attendees to be able to fully taste wine with complete discernment. Take your time between tastings, don't forget to stay hydrated, and if you have any doubt before heading home in your vehicle (even your bike!), visit the APIPAF33 stand to test your alcohol limit for free.

Look out for waste disposal

Portable ashtrays are distributed for your cigarette butts, boxes are placed at the exit for your RFID cards, glass and paper bins: here, we sort our waste! Signage and bins have been prepared so that you can free your hands and throw away any rubbish you accumulate. Sorting officers will be on hand to direct you. Thank you for taking part!

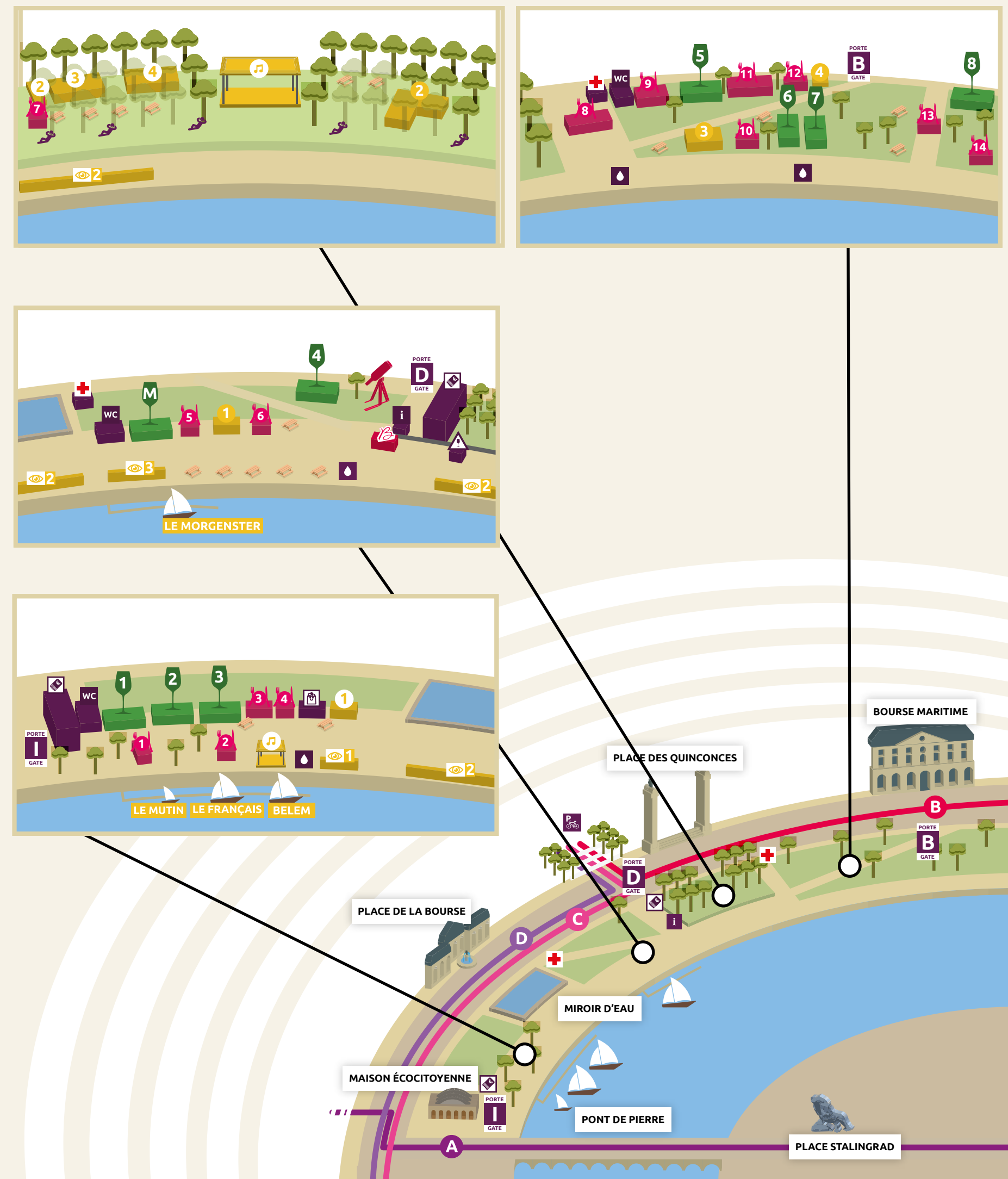
