BORDEAUX WINE FESTIVAL 2024 **A SPECIAL TASTING OF "GRANDS CRUS CLASSÉS EN 1855"** **OVER THE COURSE OF AN EVENING.**

Back from 27 to 30 June, the Bordeaux Wine Festival celebrates wine in all its forms! A prestigious tasting evening of "Grands Crus Classés en 1855" (*great wines included within the classification of 1855 established under Emperor Napoleon III*) will complete the programme for this event dedicated to the diversity of Bordeaux wines.

A VINTAGE TASTING IN AN EXCEPTIONAL LOCATION

From 27 to 30 June, the quays of the Garonne will be transformed into "appellation villages", where winegrowers and traders from the region and the general public will meet for tastings, accessible via the [Tasting Pass](#). Like the Bordeaux vineyards and their numerous appellations, the Bordeaux Wine festival aims to be as representative as possible of the plurality and richness of the wines of Bordeaux and Nouvelle-Aquitaine. As such, down by the quays, the Palais de la Bourse will host a tasting evening organised in partnership with the Conseil des Grands Crus Classés en 1855 on Thursday 27 June from 6.00pm to 9.00pm, in the presence of owners or representatives of prestigious wines. It's an opportunity to taste 7 Grands Crus Classés en 1855, Médoc and Sauternes, to discover in 3 vintages (2 "grand vin" vintages and 1 "second vin" vintage):

Haut-Médoc – Château de CAMENSAC – GCC 1855
Margaux – Château BOYD-CANTENAC – GCC 1855
St-Julien – Château LÉOVILLE POYFERRÉ – GCC 1855
Pauillac – Château GRAND-PUY DUCASSE – GCC 1855
St-Estèphe – Château LAFON ROCHET – GCC 1855
Barsac – Château NAIRAC – GCC 1855
Sauternes - Château GUIRAUD – 1er GCC 1855.

About the 1855 Grand Cru Classification :

Established in preparation for a presentation of the wines of the Gironde at the Universal Exhibition in Paris, at the request of Emperor NAPOLEON III. The Bordeaux Chamber of Commerce entrusted the classification to the "Syndicat des Courtiers de Commerce", brokers on the Bordeaux stock exchange. Their mission was to make an official classification based on long years of experience, and corresponding to recognition of the quality of the terroir and the renown of each growth. Information was drawn from the best sources. Published on 18 April 1855, the Classification was thus the culmination of a market reality and an evolution that had been going on for more than a century. gcc-1855.fr

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
